SJ/ESC01 ANOTHER BRICK IN THE WALL 07/05-22/05 RENO/CONS 12 vols 18-30

Project: Since 2002, the association Citrus has been organizing international workcamps in the Tarn-et-Garonne region. Each year, dozens of volunteers from all over the world take part in a technical workcamp of public interest, in the heart of a village.

This year, you will participate in a workcamp in the small village of Genebrières, where you will actively participate in the organisation of the village fair, on May 20th.

Work: You will be involved in the renovation of the exterior wall of the village church: removing the plaster to reveal the typical local brickwork, replacing missing bricks and renovating the joints. You will work every morning from Monday to Friday, between five and six hours a day, together with the municipal employees of the village.

Accommodation and food: You will be accommodated in a collective room with mattresses on the floor, two minutes' walk from the work site. You will have access to the village hall, facing your living quarters, and notably to the kitchen. There will be no free access to a washing machine. Every day, a team of volunteers will cook meals for the whole group, according to menus that you will have chosen collectively. Special attention will be brought to seasonal and local food. Arrangements for special diets can be made with the group leaders.

Location: Genebrières, 20 minutes from Montauban.

Leisure activities: In the heart of the Tarn-et-Garonne, you can take advantage of the possibilities of the region: swimming in the Aveyron, visiting medieval villages (Bruniquel, Penne, ...), hiking, discovering the city of Montauban, whose bricks glow in the evening light. Accompanied by two campleaders, you will meet the inhabitants in order to share this experience with them, in particular the organisation of the village fair, on May 20th, in which you will participate.

Closest train station: Montauban Ville-Bourbon (82000).

Closest airport: Toulouse-Blagnac (31000)

Travel information: From Toulouse-Blagnac airport, you will have to take a shuttle to Toulouse-Matabiau train station and then a 30-minute train to Montauban. The campleaders will meet you around 6pm in Montauban train station.

SJ/ESC09 A MEDIEVAL VILLAGE 10/06-25/06 RENO/CONS 12 vols 18-30

Project: On the edge of the Bonant valley and the gorges of Aveyron lies the village of Milhars, an ancient medieval town with stone lanes leading to its castle. With its traditional architectural heritage, the village welcomes many cyclists and hikers. It is home to many cultural and social associations: theatre, community café, etc. You will have the opportunity to mingle with the local population by taking part in the many summer varieties that take place in the area: night markets, patronal celebrations, festivals, etc.

Work: You will participate in the renovation and valorisation of the medieval village: renovation of staircases, weeding and development of planted terraces, cleaning and renovation of stone walls and of the Milhars washhouse. You will be supervised by local craftsmen.

Accommodation and food: You will be accommodated in tents of three to five people, with mattresses, next to the community hall which will be your living space. There will be no washing machine or wifi on site. Showers will be taken in the inhabitant's home, in small groups of two to three people per house each day. You will prepare meals collectively, in self-management within the group. Particular attention will be paid to a balanced diet and to local and seasonal products.

Location: Milhars, about 60km from Montauban.

Leisure activities: In the heart of the gorges of the Aveyron, you will be able to take advantage of the possibilities offered by the Tarn-et-Garonne: swimming in the Aveyron, visiting the surrounding medieval villages (Cordes-Sur-Ciel, Saint-Antonin-Noble-Val), hiking in the Bonant valley, etc. Accompanied by two campleaders, you will have the opportunity to meet the inhabitants and discover Occitania through their eyes. In the evenings and at weekends, you will discover the territory, or let your imagination run wild and organise a barbecue, a karaoke night, a folk ball, open to the population. Finally, you can organise a large international meal open to all, in order to share with the inhabitants and visitors some of your cultural specialities.

Closest train station: Lexos (commune of Varen, 82330)

Closest airport: Toulouse-Blagnac (31000)

Travel information: From Toulouse-Blagnac airport, you will have to take a shuttle to Toulouse-Matabiau train station and then a direct train to Lexos. The campleaders will meet you around 6pm at Lexos train station.

Project: Vir'Volt stands for InteRnational VolunTeer Village (Village InteRnational de VolonTaires in French). For the last 3 years, the organisation has been located right in the middle of nature, near a regional park. Hosting youth from all around the world, learning how to understand and to learn from our differences. To plan and act together to protect the environment. Location: La Ferté-Alais is approximately 50km south of Paris, in the Essonne region.

Project: The workcamp will take place at the permanent home of the REV, a former holiday camp at an altitude of 1500m. This site is located at the foot of Mont Lozère in the heart of the Cévennes. The REV took over the site last spring and wants it to become a place of hospitality, exchange and meeting. It is ideally situated on the Stevenson trail (GR70). The project therefore aims to develop the exterior so that visitors can find a pleasant place to meet international volunteers, work camp volunteers, etc.

Work: You will be involved with the team in the development of the exterior and in part of the restoration of the former holiday camp. In particular, you will be involved in clearing the paths and passages around the building (cleaning, clearing brush and cutting). You will also carry out minor masonry work. You will work 25 hours per week.

Accommodation and food: The workcamp will take place in a particularly isolated area, where you will be accommodated on the REV site in individual tents. Please bring your sleeping bag. You will have access to sanitary facilities near the camp. If the weather conditions are too bad to camp, a shelter will be available a few meters away. Meals will be provided and prepared in turn by the participants.

Location: Pont-de-Montvert, very close to the Mont Lozère, in the Cévennes, at an altitude of 1500m.

Leisure activities: As the workcamp will be held in a protected area, the majority of leisure activities will consist of discovering the surrounding nature (fauna and flora), but also the discovery of the culinary heritage. Transport will also be provided to organise discovery outings and leisure activities.

Closest train station: Génolhac station. We will meet you there between 4pm and 6pm.

Closest airports: Montpellier city airport for Europe. Marseille city airport for international flights. Trains departing from Montpellier and Marseille will take you to Génolhac via Nimes.

SJ/ESC25 LANDSCAPE IN VAUNIÈRES 2 10/07-31/07 CONS/ENVI 12 vols 18-30

Project: This year, we want to do some landscaping in Vaunières, a hamlet like no other! In the heart of the Hautes Alpes, the association *Les Villages des Jeunes* has been managing, animating, and renovating the Vaunières welcome center since 1964! It is an old mountain hamlet,

which has become a steppingstone place for local youth and adults, but also a place for French and international volunteers. Vaunières is a vacation spot for families, tourists, and groups, who come to enjoy the calm of the mountains and the dynamics of the place.

The workcamps that we organize at Vaunières with volunteers from all over the world allow us to reinforce the cultural diversity of our action and to make this site a place open to the world, where people of all ages and all social and cultural backgrounds agree to meet by working together and sharing a collective life.

Work: This summer's work will focus on the development of a landscape and the maintenance and restoration of a hiking trail. The mound is located in the centre of the hamlet, a grassy area that is now hindered by masonry structures that are no longer useful. In the aim to reduce the impact of construction on nature, the association wishes to offer more natural spaces to the people it welcomes in the hamlet. You will then participate in the creation of a relaxing space in the middle of the village life for all the people who stay here. The structures are being demolished before the summer in order to be able to offer a work site for both landscaping and furniture. Working on this trail will allow you to discover the natural areas of the Hautes-Alpes, its fauna and flora by rehabilitating the trail (clearing, signposting, etc.) and providing educational support (information panels) along the way. You will thus be able to allow everyone to enjoy this hike again.

A specialized technical supervisor will be at your side to provide you with advice and techniques. You will work approximately 30 hours per week in the morning.

Accommodation and food: Accommodation will be in individual tents, which we provide, as well as mattresses, on the camping areas of the hamlet of Vaunières, with access to showers, toilets, and the kitchen. There is no WIFI, but you will meet people from all over the world! You will take turns to cook, so that we can taste several specialties! Here, we are careful about what we eat. In order to reduce our environmental impact, we try to eat a maximum of local products and we eat meat twice a week. The daily life is organized together: organization of the menus (vegetarian, vegan and other specific diets are possible), shopping, activities, etc. Bring a mattress, a good comforter (the nights can be cold) and a pillow. To be adapted to your needs.

Location: Le Hameau de Vaunières, 6km from the village St Julien en Beauchêne, is 23km away from the city of Veynes.

Once or twice a week, we organize with our vehicles some grocery shopping outings.

Leisure activities: We will be in an exceptional location to discover the joys of hiking among the mountains, its rivers, its lakes, the farmers markets, and festive events organized in the surrounding villages (depending on programming). As a group, we will decide the activities and outings that we want to set up (subject to distance). Once a week, the welcome center generally organizes a musical evening with homemade wood fired pizzas.

Closest train station : Lus-La-Croix-Haute (26620) and Veynes-Dévoluy. The meeting times at the arrival train station will be communicated to you on the route map (no schedule available at this time).

Closest airports : Marseille or Lyon.

SJ/ESC26 TRACING THE STEPS OF THE DUKE OF LESDIGUIERES 10/07-31/07 RENO 11 vols 18-30

Project: Do you want to participate in the protection of a historic site in the heart of idyllic mountain landscapes? Join us and come discover the castle of Lesdiguières and its natural setting at an altitude of 1140 metres!

The Duke of Lesdiguières, the last Constable of France, is a military figure known for his participation in the Wars of Religion and for his involvement in the construction and development of

roads, bridges, and dikes against flooding in the region. This castle was built between 1571 and 1580 and was abandoned after his death. It was looted during the French Revolution. The castle is listed in the supplementary inventory of Historic Monuments in 1978. In 2000, the *Château de Lesdiguières* association was created with the aim of safeguarding the historical, architectural, and cultural memory of the building. Since 2010, the various works that we have been organising on this site are aimed at securing and reinforcing the existing walls, but also at enhancing its value.

Work: Since 2018, we have been working on the reinforcement of the masonry of an escarpment wall (defence wall). Over the years, this wall has suffered some damage and its stones are coming loose. With the help of the technical supervisor, we will work with old techniques and materials (such as lime). At certain times, we will work at height, using scaffolding. We will work around 30 hours per week.

Accommodation and food: You will be accommodated in individual tents on the site of the Holy Family colony not far from the work site, located at the entrance to the Valgaudemar valley. We will spend a quiet stay in the campsite in a mountainous and exceptional green setting. We will have access to facilities such as toilets, barbecue, pétanque ground, WIFI. We will set up a large kitchen tent in order to prepare our meals (vegetarian, vegan and other specific diets possible). You will cook in turn, so that you can taste several specialties!

Here, we pay attention to what we eat, to reduce our environmental impact, we try to eat a maximum of local products and we eat meat twice a week. The daily life is organized together: organization of menus, shopping, activities, etc. The lunch will be cold as it will be taken on the construction site. Bring a mattress, a good sleeping bag (the nights can be cold) and a pillow. To be adapted to your needs.

Location: The work camp and camp site are located in the village of Glaizil. We are about 15 km from Saint Bonnet en Champsaur and 30 km from Gap. Once or twice a week, we will organize with our vehicles some shopping outings!

Leisure activities: In the heart of the Ecrins National Park, between the Valgaudemar, Champsaur and Dévoluy valleys, your will be able to enjoy this exceptional environment! We can discover the pleasures of hiking in the mountains, its rivers and lakes, farmers' and producers' markets, and festive evenings organized in the surrounding villages (depending on the programme). As a group, we will decide which activities and discovery outings we will wish to organize.

Closest train station: Gap (05000). We will meet you at the station between 4pm and 6pm.

Closest airports: Marseille or Lyon.

Location: Montcombroux les Mines (45kms away from Moulins).

SJ/ESC51 IN MY GARDEN 06/08-26/08 ENVI 12 vols 18-30

Project: Our team of 15 people from all over the world live collectively on the domain of les Prureaux. We all carry out an ambitious project there: to renovate and maintain its main building which is a centuries-old castle. Come join the adventure! Our environmental pole is made of a farm, a vegetable garden, an orchard, and a garden. We experiment with the principles of permaculture, to make the area a harmonious, productive ecosystem, aiming for autonomy, naturally regenerated and respectful of nature and all its inhabitants. Two years ago, a group of teenagers provided great work to clean up the garden. It is now time to restore and replace the natural elements that were used for that work, thanks to a new motivated group!

Work: Like the whole site, the garden and the vegetable garden are constantly evolving. On the program this year we want to protect and delimit: The garden and the vegetable garden must be protected from external intrusions (fauna, flora, bad weather). You will build barriers and low walls to delimit the space using different materials: dry branches and roots, dry stones, small fruit trees according to ancestral techniques: plessing, braiding, piling, etc.

You will participate in enriching the natural fertilizer via the "lasagna" these are alternating stacks of layers matter, which have a "booster" effect on soil from technique: of organic the crops.

Le Créneau wishes to develop its natural spaces and integrate them into the daily life of its

inhabitants: you will repair the garden hut, and make it a place of storage but also of gathering and discussion for school visits, by arranging a space in reused materials: pallets, etc.

Accommodation and food: You will be hosted on Le Créneau's camping, in collective tents (5-6 persons per tent) with wooden floor and beds. Wi-fi is not available on site. Food will be provided and prepared by the participants in groups, with the support of the cooking staff.

Location: Montcombroux les Mines (45kms away from Moulins).

Leisure activities: Afternoons and weekends are planned collectively with the group leaders. If you want to discover the cities around, Vichy and Moulins are 45 kms away. If you'd rather have a nice walk in the nature, the surroundings are perfect for hiking, landscape seeing, discovering local markets, swim, and enjoy sports activities and games.

Closest train station: Let's meet at 5pm at Moulins-sur-Allier train station.

Closest airports: Paris or Lyon. From Paris, there are direct trains to Moulins-sur-Allier (3 hour-trip). From Lyon, it will take you around 2h10 by direct train.

Project: At the gateway to the Provençal Baronnies, the site of Arzeliers stands on a small mountain with a beautiful view over the Durance valley. This ancient, ruined village is the cradle of the commune of Laragne: the remains of a chapel and the ruins of several houses can still be found there. For several years, the commune of Laragne has been working to bring the remains of the Arzeliers castle to life, maintain and develop them. Since 2013, international youth volunteer workcamps have been organised for this purpose with the Les Villages des Jeunes associations. Following these successful experiences, it is proposed to continue the conservation work in 2023.

Work: The work in 2022 allowed us to work on the enhancement of the site thanks to the recovery of the plaster that was used as mortar in the walls that had collapsed. This year, we will be able to discover the cycle of this local material. The aim of the work is to make a "peasant plaster" mortar and to restore the walls of a building in order to consolidate them and prevent them from deteriorating further. A specialised technical supervisor will be at your side to give you advice and techniques. You will work approximately 30 hours per week.

Accommodation and food: You will be accommodated in individual tents that we will provide you at the municipal campsite of Laragne-Montéglin. A mobile home will be at your disposal to cook and to have access to sanitary facilities. You will take turns to cook, so that we can taste several specialities! Here, we pay attention to what we eat, to reduce our environmental impact, we try to eat a maximum of local products and we eat meat twice a week. The daily life is organized together: organisation of menus (vegetarian, vegan and other specific diets are possible), shopping, activities, etc. Bring a good sleeping bag (the nights can be very cold in September) and a pillow. To be adapted to your needs.

Situation: Laragne-Montéglin is a small town in the Hautes-Alpes where all services are within walking distance. One of the most important farmers' markets takes place in the town every Thursday morning. You can find excellent olives and other specialities!

Leisure activities: With the animation team, you will be able to discover this beautiful region during hikes, swimming trips and/or relaxation in lakes or gorges. You will also be able to discover the architectural heritage, with many villages dating back to medieval times. During the evenings, games, barbecues, meetings with the locals, international meals or just relaxing will be possible. It is up to you to choose your programme. You will be in the heart of the Parc des Baronnies Provençales to discover the pleasures of hiking in the mountains, its rivers, its lakes, the farmers' and producers' markets, the festive evenings organised in the surrounding villages (according to the programme). As a group, you will decide on the activities and discovery outings you wish to organise.

Closest train station: Laragne-Montéglin. The meeting times at the arrival train station will be communicated to you on the infosheet (no schedule available at this time).

Closest airports: Marseille or Lyon.
